

Over 400 injured servicemembers and their family members gained creative opportunities to improve physical, mental and emotional healing, recovery and rehabilitation.

Pantomime (acting without words, only movement) some of your favorite sports or activities to explore how it may feel to engage in them.



EL: No. Doing this in a large group makes it easy. Things are always harder by yourself.






Mary Ann Dawedeit (Eli's Mom)

Eli got to be one of the Kings at the Kennedy Center Page-to-Stage Festival, and that was super special, and a lifelong dream of his. Eli was impressed because he knew Connor through work but since Connor couldn't make it, he called Eli. And that, as a 27-year-old man, is important. Your guy needs you! It was so cheerful to be a part of that connection. Eli wasn't even in the company that was invited, but they called on him! How great is that? That is community. You know these kinds of things don't happen on a day-to-day basis for a person with visible differences, so it was meaningful.


Financial Data FY2018


